**Plan of Operations for Lot 7, Wells 7-13,7-14,7-15,7-16,7-17,7-18,7-19,7-20,7-21,7-22**

**March 17, 2007**

Duhring Resource Company is planning to drill ten new wells on the land of the Allegheny National Forest Lot 7, Sheffield Township, Warren County. This is a continuation of a five well project started in the Spring of 2006, and a six well project started in the Fall of 2006. Improvements will include roads to the wells, well locations, and any support structures (culverts, silt fence, pipelines, etc.) that will be needed to build well locations. The roads, locations, and support structures will be constructed according to the typical specifications for oil and gas development as provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection publication #550-0300-001, the Oil and Gas Operators Manual, and the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan as prepared by Hampson Surveying, March, 2007. All operations will be performed to limit erosion and sedimentation, and impact upon the land.

Per the direction of Tom Ferrel, Allegheny National Forest representative, the shale for the original five well project and the six well project was to be obtained from the shale pit on F.S. 103 located just west of the project area. The shale for the additional ten well project will be similarly obtained. As of the submission of this plan no trees will need to be removed in order to uncover and remove the shale. However, it is observed that other operators are currently removing shale. The extent of that removal is not known to Duhring and if tree removal is necessary it can be accomplished in conjunction with tree removal for roadways and locations.

The date operations will start depends on how long it will take to obtain permits, the availability of earth moving crews, drilling crews, and the weather. The object is to have permits available when the drillers are free, and the weather is cooperating. All schedules permitting, it is hoped that the project will start this summer.
